From the Chair ...

A Happy New Year to you all. Motorsport is a year-round sporting scene and so many events in many disciplines have already run in the 2013 season. Let us hope that what passed for "summer" in our nation has more in the way of sun in the sky and somewhat less of the rain to which we were subjected in 2012!

One of the early exercises in which the ASWMC was involved was hosting the first South West Go Motorsport! Road Show in Cornwall and seemed to be well received by those who attended. These events are aimed at clubs and are primarily concerned with development in terms of membership, communication, and marketing. It is not a lecture but a communal exercise in which everyone is encouraged to contribute so that clubs learn from each other, supported by the Go Motorsport! Community, who have themselves learned from similar events elsewhere in the country. The ASWMC Executive will now consider other areas of our region in which similar Road Shows can be held.

On the subject of Go Motorsport!, we now have new Regional Development Officers. Our primary RDO is Kevin Moore (<u>SouthWest@GoMotorsport.net</u>) who will deal with most of our region. However some clubs will also encounter Andrew Bisping, who will deal with clubs in the north and farther to the east of our region; he can be contacted at <u>Central@GoMotorsport.net</u>. Both are familiar with our motor sport disciplines, possibly to a greater extent than was the case with their predecessor.

My next subject is, I have to admit, one with which I have very little first-hand knowledge - route authorisation. This has been conducted in the past in manual form (map tracings) which were then posted to the MSA, RLOs, Forestry Commission, Police, National Parks officials, etc. A new digital mapping software solution called "Quo" is now being progressively introduced around the country. Using this system, with digital OS maps bought from Mapyx (at a very real discount from the paper versions, costing just pence) the route, including all the control locations, can be planned and specified, and then submitted for authorisation. Go to www.mapyx.com to learn more and to download the Quo software).

Lastly, I'm sure that clubs will be pleased to learn than in 2013 the enhanced level of help from the MSA Club Development Fund will continue.

2013 Sprint Championship

By Mid-March, 65 hill climb and 55 sprint competitors had registered for the championship, suggesting that these disciplines, at least, continue to weather the storm of recession better than expected. If the weather itself also finally climbs out of recession by April, all will be well for 2013!

The season started with the Great Western Sprint at Castle Combe on the 23rd of March – the weather was poor to say the least, only drying slightly for the later runs. 16 registered contenders scored points and there is now a 3 way tie at the top of the table. The first two sprints of the year have been over-subscribed, with both the GWS and Clay Pigeon events turning competitors away

2013 Autocross Championship

By early March we had 13 registrations; six clubs will be running 15 rounds between them, from 21st April – Weston MC's Sand-o-Cross – to the 6th October – North Devon MC's Sugworthy event. All 2012 and new 2013 contenders have been sent regs and some early entries are in!

I am pleased to note that the MSA have now clarified the ruling concerning junior drivers in the discipline. They now only have to prove their capability to the Clerk of the Course by driving an observed lap once – thereafter proof of competition in previous events is all that is required. The regulation to read is N 3.2.4.

The ruling on Juniors (Class F) having to run within their own class only has to be enforced and they must not run with competitor in Class A1, either in practise or timed runs.

2013 Car Trials Championship

Registration for the Car Trial championship is still free of charge so it makes sense for Classic Trials championship contenders to also register for the Car Trials championship, even if you are likely to participate only occasionally.

Please note that the championship has now added Ross and District M.C.'s "Spring Fling" in Herefordshire, increasing the number of championship rounds to an unprecedented eight rounds, of which the best 6 will count. Please note that Launceston & NC MC have brought their Motor Traders Trial forward from their normal September date to Jun 9th.

The first round of the championship, Woolbridge Motor Club's Hogcliff Hill Car Trial, took place in fine weather and attracted an excellent 24 clubman entries. Disappointingly, the championship class yielded only five, two of which were ASWMC contenders. Rather surprisingly all these were class 1 un-ballasted FWD cars – two Renault Clios, two Vauxhall Novas and a Nissan Micra.

Stroud's Duncan Stephens in his Nova (notably with Classic trials expert Nick Farmer as his passenger!) dropped just 34 points to emerge the convincing winner, 10 points ahead of rarely defeated BTRDA star Barrie Parker in his Clio. Chris Judge's Micra, faced with such high class opposition, was 5th in class, dropping 91. Duncan achieved the lowest overall score of the day against the ballasted cars of all classes in the clubman event, suggesting either unusually dry conditions or some superlative driving, and possibly both.

The second round will be the Bristol Pegasus Dundry trial on April 28th, by which time we should have a few more contenders. With the participation of new competitors such as Camel Vale's Hans Viertel and Roger Bricknell in the 2013 championship the competition promises to be rather more interesting this year.
