

From the Chair ...

In the Summer Newsletter I mentioned that the ASWMC Executive would be investigating what content would be best for the remainder of the Go Motorsport Roadshows, which were launched at the beginning of this year in Cornwall. At our August meeting we agreed on the way forward only to then learn that the MSA would be including this topic in their 2014 MSA Seminars for Club and other unlicensed officials.

During November the MSA will be providing long-awaited training for Child Protection Officers. These will be appropriate for those who are either already licensed in the role, representing their club, or have aspirations to do so. The first will be on Wednesday 6th November at the Buckerell Lodge Hotel, Exeter, and the second at the Aztec Hotel, Bradley Stoke, Bristol, on Thursday 7th November. Each seminar will have a 6.45 p.m. meeting time ready for a 7.00 p.m. start, with a finish time before 10.00 p.m. Expenses will be payable in the form of a mileage allowance to and from the venues at the rate of 36p per mile. It is vitally important that each club is represented at the venue nearest to you. Reply slips to advise the MSA who is attending from your club have been issued and I can provide extra slips if you are unable to lay your hands on one.

To date, despite my plea in the summer newsletter, only about half of our clubs have provided dates for the 2014 ASWMC calendar. Now I know how difficult this task is, as many dates in your own club's calendar are not yet "final". Although the ASWMC Year Book is not "put to bed" until the end of the year, it really helps everyone if you give us some idea of your club's planned events, their dates and where they are likely to be, now. That's a good starting point – the dates can then be varied if necessary over the next few months. So, if your club has not yet provided its dates **please now do so.**

Lastly just to let you all know that at the next ASWMC AGM on Sunday 27th October you will have the opportunity to meet two representatives from the MSA. One is the new MSA CEO Nick Bunting, who began his role in May this year. I am sure that many of you will want to meet him and learn how he views the MSA, and what it does, and you'll be able to take the opportunity to question him on issues of particular interest to you. He will be joined by Allan Dean-Lewis, whom many of you will know from the Training Seminars.

Tony Greenwood 1937 - 2013

The ASWMC are saddened to hear of the passing of Tony on the 14th September 2013.

Tony was born in Worcester on March 27th 1937 and moved a few years later to Yorkshire to work for the British Wool Marketing Board. There he met and married his first wife Pam and they moved to the South West in 1965. Tony spent nearly 30 years living in the West Country, before moving to Chichester with his second wife Sheila, where he spent the rest of his life.

Tony was Vice Chairman of the ASWMC from 1976 to 1998 and was responsible for setting up and establishing the ASWMC Marshals Training Register. Tony remained part of the ASWMC as a Vice President until his death. He was a very successful road rally navigator, winning the 1982 ASWMC Road Rally Championship with Dave Pitcher in an immaculate, original-livery, 2.2 Lotus Sunbeam.

The ASWMC sends its condolences to Tony's family, his two sons Richard and Andrew, his stepdaughter Sarah and four grandchildren, Mark, Dan, Lauren and Rebecca.

There will be a memorial service in Exeter on Tuesday 22nd October 2013 at 2:30 p.m. at St James Church, Mount Pleasant Road - EX4 7AH.

The family are supporting research into Parkinson's disease and donations towards this cause will be gratefully received.

Castle Combe Rally Day

By invitation from Go Motorsport!, the ASWMC was represented at the annual Rally Day on 21st September by four of this year's regular autocross competitors, one from each of four classes, as part of their 'grass roots' display. We were all surprised at how un-informed motor sport enthusiasts seem to be about Autocross and we were able to encourage many to seriously consider having a go at the discipline. By the end of the day we had (hopefully!) convinced a few enthusiasts to give autocross serious consideration.



It was evident that quite a few people seemed to know more about autograss than autocross but did not seem to be too impressed with the former! When the differences were explained, the benefits of autocross became apparent, generating real interest. Most visitors were also surprised by the comparatively low cost of the sport compared to other speed events such as sprints and hill climbs. Improving the profile of autocross at grass roots level is a task we can continue to tackle from the base of the strong support in the South West.

Women in Motorsport

Many of you will be aware of me if only because I process your registration application and issue you with your registration card. Not so many also know that I attend many events across the region as a marshal and like most marshals, in all weathers – wet and dry - on a rally stage, replacing chicanes you sometimes have difficulty negotiating, the cones which somehow get under your wheels and all the other tasks which befall marshals. You may also see me hill climbs, sprints, trials and autotests, not just rally stages. I have competed in autocross, hill climb, sprint, rally and autotest events in the past, mainly in the days when you drove your car to the event, competed and then used it on the Monday to go to work. Within my own club I am the Secretary and Vice Chairman – in a busy club, promoting over 25 events a year, there is always something to be done!

I joined the ASWMC Executive as the Cornwall Liaison member in 2008 and am also the South West's delegate to the 'Women in Motorsport' group, at which every region of the UK, from the Channel Isles to Northern Ireland, is represented. The object of the group is to encourage women into the sport, not just as competitors but also to carry out the many tasks that make events viable – without marshals and organisers, no event can run and motorsport as we know it would stop! So, if you are reading this and wondering about doing something more than just watching, please approach your local club or the organisers of the events you attend - you will meet a wide variety of people and get close to the action, either 'trackside' or by helping to organise events.

The Women in Motorsport group are conducting a survey over the coming months, asking about your views of women in the sport; please respond when it pops up on your e-mail and support us in driving up the percentage of women in 'our' sport.

2013 Sprint Championship

The 2013 Bridge Tyres & Wheels Point S ASWMC Sprint Championship sees Ian Parr in an uncatchable position going into the final round and he has won the Championship relatively easily this year. All of the other places have been well fought and are up for grabs at the last round, Bournemouth & District's Clay Pigeon event.

It is hugely disappointing that the sprint championship now lacks any rounds in Devon or Cornwall, which may account for the drop in championship registrations. Portreath will be back on the calendar in 2014, run by Newquay AC. Venues are a perennial problem and it would be great to see some local clubs' reluctance to run at Preddannack turned around, as the track, although a little bumpy in places, is excellent. Travel distance for competitors may be an issue, although it is little further than Portreath from crossing into Cornwall. Running events, even if there is a small financial penalty in the short term, is the most important way to re-establish the discipline throughout the South-West.

Amazingly this year, compared with 2012 when almost every event was wet, all the events were, more or less, run in the dry; 'well done' to South Hams MC for reading the forecast so well and completing all the runs of the final championship round before the rain arrived!

Overall we can be very pleased with the Championship this year; each event was supported by an average of 16 contenders, with the average entry per event down only a little on last year at an average of 30. The highest number of contenders was 20 and the lowest 11; the best entries were on the final two rounds (both 38) and the lowest entry 24. I was particularly encouraged by the general buzz of enthusiasm for Autocross at the final two rounds and it was good to see some 'old' faces back to 'have a go', which I hope bodes well for increased support next year.

Looking ahead, I am hoping that we might see some new events in the calendar in 2014; I'm also aiming to fill the huge gap with no events between the end of May and the middle of June. This newsletter goes to event organisers and so I'm looking forward to hearing positive news about dates and venues before too long. I am also very keen to persuade our neighbouring Associations to promote Autocross through their communication network.

The final results of the Championship are shown below; the top five finishers will be presented with their awards at the Awards Celebration in February 2014. Incidentally, it is good to see that of the eight classes run in our Championship, five are represented in the Top 5, which demonstrated how successful the scoring system is.

2013 Car Trials Championship

Three contenders, Hans Viertel, Mark Hoppe and Simon Oates travelled to the Clifford Hooper trial, and Stroud and District are to be congratulated on an excellent entry of 38, demonstrating a renewed interest in Car Trials in the Gloucester area which should provide some encouragement to other South-Western clubs.

There was a nicely balanced entry across the classes, with both Mark and Hans encountering serious opposition. Rather unfairly in my view, Mark, who is accustomed to running unballasted in class 1, had to compete against ballasted cars as Stroud are not yet convinced that there is a need to provide for them. Mark's 5th in class from 10 entries was consequently a considerable achievement. His 4 championship points were well deserved, as his score of 42 was substantially below the class average.

Hans also had to work hard for his 5th place in class 3, in an 8 car entry that included the Stroud experts. Unfortunately the results do not list the cars but no doubt there was a strong Hillman Imp presence! Hans' score of 35 was the best of the three contenders.

Simon had a slightly easier task in class 5 but his 3rd in class, dropping a score of 41, earned him 6 more championship points and moved him up to 4th in the table above David Robinson.

Having contested 7 out of 8 championship rounds, Hans has now an unbeatable lead in the championship with the well-known silver classic trials Beetle but, with only 4 points separating Duncan Stephens, Mark Hoppe and Simon Oates, the remaining two podium positions will not be settled until the last round, the popular Farnborough & Dist.MC Hungry Hill trial at Aldershot on November 10th.
