

Welcome to the 2014 ASWMC Championship Summer Newsletter

My apologies are due for the later than planned appearance of the summer newsletter, which was due to a family bereavement disrupting my schedule. The next issue will be mid-way between now and the end-of season Christmas edition, so as the final championship events take place please send in your stories and pictures. I'm also happy to reprint articles from club magazines and newsletters that editors think deserve a wider audience across the region — so please forward this at club level to your scribes and compilers and encourage them to publicise your clubs events and activities through this newsletter.

The big news is the Government's intention to give power to Local Authorities to suspend sections of the Road Traffic Act to permit motor sport on closed public roads, after a long campaign by the MSA. Your Chairman writes at length about the implications of this in his 'Chairman's Chat'. I'm aware that this isn't completely welcome in some sections of the motor sport world but, as the UK follows Europe's long-standing example, we will have to make the best of the opportunities the legislation will present. Some closures might bring huge benefit for almost no cost the crossing of the Tirabad road at Dixie's on Epynt for example - but new closed road rallies will require a phenomenal amount of organisation, safety measures, staffing and, probably, cost, as cashstrapped councils see an opportunity to swell their coffers. Even without road closures to contemplate, the Tour of Cornwall required the combined efforts of three Cornish clubs, and those of you who've competed on the Isle of Man, or on Mull, will appreciate the level of planning required. This will be a steep learning curve for organisers, who may have to cooperate with neighbouring clubs like never before if they are to have the organisational strength in depth that will be needed. A new and exciting phase of motorsport on the mainland is in prospect, but it won't be easy.

Diary Dates ...

The next ASWMC Council meetings will be at the AGM on Sunday 26th October, at the Hartnoll Hotel, Bolham, near Tiverton.

The 2015 ASWMC Championship awards presentation will be on Sunday 22nd February, In mid-July the Prime Minister announced to the nation that legislation to enable "racing" to take place on public roads would be included in the Deregulation Bill (which is about halfway through its passage through Parliament). I think the likelihood of "racing" taking place in England, Scotland and Wales, in the same way as motorcycle racing does in Northern Ireland and the Isle of Man, has to be considered pretty remote.

The legislation is designed to enable motor clubs to liaise with their local authorities and acquire road closure orders for Special Stage Rallies, Sprints and Hillclimbs. I freely admit I know little about the former but I suspect the relationship with the local authority for a road closure will be similar to that with landowners for special stage rallies.

For a Hillclimb, the issues for a "closed road" event may not be very different to those at existing venues. The club will need to take any safety measures needed to acquire an MSA Track Licence and the relationship with the local authority to enable the road closure order will be similar to the relationship with current hillclimb venue landowners. Clubs will need to allow for space at one end for a "top paddock" and paddock facilities at the other, in addition to the course itself.

Clubs should be in no doubt that obtaining a road closure order from their local authority may not be straightforward. Local Authorities will almost certainly require a very detailed Risk Assessment to cover both the "sport related" issues and spectator protection. I am sure most local authorities will be very conscious of the fatalities on the 2014 Jim Clark Rally; this event has taken place on closed public roads for a number of years covered by the provisions of its own Act of Parliament.

Clubs will also need to carry out very time-consuming and detailed public relations work, including notices on the road itself and in local papers. Thought will have to be given to how and when residents on a closed road can access their property and alternative routes to circumnavigate the closed section.

Road closures tend to be time-sensitive, with strict closing and re-opening times; there can be no half-measures or delays and the police may attend to ensure that the road is re-opened on time. Being fully aware of the potential time scale of the event when the request for a road closure is

submitted will be important; failure to follow the order to the letter could mean that the local authority will refuse a road closure order in the future.

The ASWMC Executive is keen to liaise with member clubs when the bill becomes law, probably in the New Year, to support them in exploring and taking advantage of this new development in motor sport.

Finally I am pleased that ASWMC Championship registrations have increased from last year, although in most instances there are still fewer contenders compared to a few years ago.

Full marks are due to Alan Frame and his team for giving competitors some sort of an event in conditions that could not have been worse - a digger and two tractors were on hand to eliminate the deep ruts in one or two places and to extract the cars that got stuck ...

Once again the problem of last minute entries seems to be causing headaches for organisers; if some competitors leave their entries until a day or two before an event this could (and in the case of Weston did) result in losing a round of the Championship. Weston-S-M MC were completely within their rights to cancel as insufficient entries were received before the closing date. If more clubs stuck to the wording of the SRs, and either postponed or cancelled on the closing date, we would lose yet more rounds. Please try and help event organisers by sending your entries in plenty of time; there is always a clause that permits cancellation up until a few days before the event so you'll not lose out if your car is not ready to drive. Thanks.

And finally, after some delicate negotiations with the landowner, the SRs for the Witney MC event (August 23rd/24th) will be out very soon ... if you intend to compete, please put your entry in now!

2014 Car Trials Championship

Round 6, the Launceston, NCMC Motor Traders Trial, achieved a 26 car entry, which was a great improvement on the 2013 event, and in spite of the rapidly drying conditions provided six continually challenging sections.

The top 4 ASWMC championship contenders were competing, with David Robinson's Reliant finishing 2nd in class 2, and 2nd overall, dropping only 22 points; he was up against Holsworthy's legendary Arnie Martin in his Escort who dropped only 16 points. Hans Viertel, who was unfamiliar with his "new" Toyota MR2 (not an MX5 as previously reported!) scored 69 to lead a two car class 3 and Mark Hoppe in the un-ballasted Saxo dropped 76 to win class 0, just 3 points ahead of Camel Vale's Phillip Thomas in a well driven Peugeot 205.

I battled all day with our latest contender, Tim Edwards, double driving my Suzuki X90, and was relieved to finish with 78 points for 4th in class 2, against his 89, after he had established a worrying 11 point lead in round 1! (all down to the number of markers hit!). Thanks must go to Launceston MC for a very enjoyable event.

As a result of this Mark Hoppe has increased his championship lead by 2 more points, making David Robinsons' challenge more difficult, but with 3 more rounds to go anything can still happen. Hans Viertel is in a strong 3rd place, 10 points clear of his next challenger, but only 9 behind David.

The Inter Association Car Trials championship is being incorporated into the Wolverhampton and South Staffs Gabby Mohr car trial on Sunday 14th September; this is not an ASWMC championship round but is a prestigious event nevertheless. The ASWMC are looking to field a team; Mark Hoppe and John Moffat have indicated that they are available and we are asking if any other contenders who would like to join a very competitive team. If you fancy a trip up north in September, please let me know if you are available as soon as possible. The venue is close to Bridgenorth, on the Shropshire borders.

Rally Round-Up

Josh Payton has taken a commanding lead over championship sponsor Steve Furzeland in the Sealed Surface series, with daughter Danielle just 7 points adrift in third. Only 9 points separate the leading pair's co-drivers. Martin and Dawn England are the runaway leaders in the Drivers and Co-Drivers' loose-surface championship tables.

On the highways and byways, the road navigational rally championships are close-fought affairs. Kevin Wills leads Chris Pratt by just 3 points in the Open section of the, with Liam Burns enjoying only a slightly greater margin over Jeff Brown in the race for the navigators' title. In the Novice section, Tom Pile leads Gareth Butler by just 6 points, with Mark Butler ahead of Luke Quinnel by the same margin. The Endurance Road Rally championship sees Paul Watts with a 33 point lead, although leading co-driver Ross Whittock has only a slender 2 point advantage over rivals David Thorpe and Andrew Lowe.
