SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. Announcement:

Torbay Motor Club will organise & promote a NATIONAL "B" Hillclimb on Saturday 18th May 2019 at Wiscombe Park, Near Honiton, Devon, EX24 6JE.

2. Jurisdiction:

The event will be held under the General Regulations of the Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the organisers may issue for the event.

3. Championships, Permits & Eligibility:

3.1 Eligibility

The event is open to Registered Contenders in the 2019 TyreMarks ASWMC Hillclimb Championship, the 2019 Tillicoultry Quarries Wiscombe Hillclimb Championship, the 2019 Hamilton Motorsport Ltd ACSMC Hillclimb Championship, the 2019 Torbay Motor Club Speed Championship, the 2019 DEWS Speed Series, the 2019 TVRCC Hillclimb Championship and the 2019 MGCC Speed Championship.

Members of the organising club and the following:

Aston Martin Owners Club, RSSOC, TVR Car Club, members of member clubs of the Association of South Western Motor Clubs, members of member clubs of the Association of Central Southern Motor Clubs and members of the MGCC.

Championship Registration Cards, Club Membership Cards and Competition Licences will be inspected at Signing On.

4. Time Schedule: The format of the event will be as follows:

Signing on (note 1): Marshals: 07.00 a.m. – 08.00 a.m.

Drivers: 07.00 a.m. – 09.30 a.m.

Scrutineering (note 2): 07.30 a.m. – 09.30 a.m.

Drivers Briefing (note 3): 08.00 a.m. (attendance mandatory)

Practice: 08.30 a.m.

First Timed Run: On completion of practice.

- Note 1 Any competitor not signed on by 09.30am may be excluded.
- Note 2 Drivers of vehicles awaiting Scrutineering inspection in paddock space must leave a representative with the vehicle (with the competitor's helmet, overalls & gloves) whilst walking the course.
- Note 3 The drivers briefing will be held outside 'Sign-on'.

5. Track details:

The length of the course is 1000 yards (914 Metres) consisting of several fast bends, two sharp left-hand corners and one sharp right-hand corner.

6. Classes:

Cars competing in any championship must comply with the appropriate technical regulations for that Championship. All cars entered in these championships will be re-classified for points-scoring purposes into the appropriate championship class. (See 6.1, below).

The event will operate according to the following classes and order:

- Class A1 - Roadgoing Series Production Cars up to 1400cc.
- Class A2 - Roadgoing Series Production Cars over 1400cc up to 1800cc.
- Class A3 - Roadgoing Series Production Cars over 1800cc up to 2600cc.
- Class A4 - Roadgoing Series Production Cars over 2600cc.
- Class B1 - Roadgoing Specialist Production Cars car engine up to 1400cc.
- Class B2 - Roadgoing Specialist Production Cars car engine 1401 - 1800cc.
- Class B3 - Roadgoing Specialist Production Cars car engine over 1800cc, M/C engines
- Class C1 - Modified Series Production Cars up to 1400cc.
- Class C2 - Modified Series Production Cars over 1400cc up to 1800cc.
- Class C3 - Modified Series Production Cars over 1800cc.
- Class C4 - Modified Specialist Production Cars, car engines, & M/C engines.
- Class D1 - Sports Libre Cars up to 1800cc.
- Class D2 - Sports Libre Cars over 1800cc.
- Class D3 - Rally Cars.
- Class E1 - Racing Cars up to 1100cc.
- Class E2 - Racing Cars over 1100cc up to 1600cc.
- Class E3 - Racing Cars over 1600cc up to 2000cc.
- Class E4 - Racing Cars over 2000c
- Class F1 - D.E.W.S
- Class F2 - TVR-A; TVR cars with 4- or 6-cylinder engines built before 1st January 1992
- Class F3 - TVR-B; all other TVR's
- Class F4 – MG Car Club

Important points relating to Classes and Vehicles:

- 6.1 When completing the Entry Form, drivers are reminded to indicate the event class and championship class (which may be different) for correct points allocation.
- 6.2 All vehicles must comply with the appropriate Motorsport UK regulations for the event.
- 6.3 The onus of responsibility for the eligibility of vehicles competing in championships rests with the entrant/competitor. Where disputes occur relating to vehicle compliance, the onus will be on the competitor to satisfy the Championship Coordinator of the vehicle's eligibility, NOT for the Championship Coordinator to demonstrate compliance.
- 6.4 Cars in Classes A1 to E4 must conform to relevant definitions in Section **S10 to S15.2.1** of the 2019 Motorsport UK regulations.
- 6.5 Cars with engines using non-diesel fuel and fitted with forced induction will be subject to a 40% capacity increase. Cars with engines running on diesel fuel will be subject to a 30% capacity reduction.
- 6.6 All vehicles must be fitted with a silencer at all times. A noise test will be carried out on all cars prior to practice and vehicles must comply with **J5.17.1 to J5.17.8**
- 6.7 Cars in Classes D3 must comply with Motorsport UK Technical Regulations **R46.1 to R49.11.4**. Included in the latter category are Group B cars, any car without the original engine block of the model entered, any car with a transmission layout not originally specified for that model, or a Specialist Rally Car without an engine complying with **S12.6.2**. They need not be taxed.

Note: Wiscombe Ltd cannot provide the infrastructure required by Motorsport UK for Hybrid and Electric vehicles and entries for these types of vehicles cannot be accepted.

7. Practice & Event Runs:

Competitors will be allowed one practice run in accordance with **S.2.1.1** and **2.1.4** although Regulation **S2.2** will be enforced. In addition, **S2.1.1** will apply, permitting competitors to walk the course. Circumstances permitting, competitors will be given the opportunity of a minimum of three timed event runs; if time permits, an extra timed run will be allowed, with the best time to count.

8. Competitor Numbering:

Competitors are responsible for providing their own competition numbers as per Regulation **J4.1 & S9.2.5**. Drivers of shared cars must ensure that the correct number is displayed for each run. Second drivers will share the same number as first drivers with the addition of an 'A' suffix (the 'A' must be at least 50% of the size of the main number). Times set by cars not correctly identified may be disallowed.

9. Paddock:

Each competitor will have paddock space allocated to their competition car. Cars must be unloaded as instructed on arrival and trailers parked as directed by the officials as quickly as possible to avoid congestion. **Bicycles, skateboards, rollerblades, pit bikes & mini-motos are not permitted anywhere on the venue.**

10. Awards (Sponsored by Fusion Fostering Ltd) will be presented as follows:

The number of awards for each class will be determined by the number of entries received by the close of entries date in SR13, not the number of entries in the class on the day of the event. Prizes will be awarded as soon as practically possible after declaration of the Results. No competitor may win more than one award. Regrettably the organisers cannot forward those awards that are not collected at the prize giving.

Perpetual Awards (*) remain the property of the Club shown in SR1 and must be returned upon request.

11. Number of Entries:

The maximum entry for the event is 120, the minimum is 60. The minimum for each class is 3. No car may be entered in more than one class or be driven by more than two drivers. A driver may drive a maximum of two cars, which MUST be in different classes. Drivers entering two cars must specify which entry has priority.

12. Organisers rights regarding Number of Entries:

Should any of the above minimum figures not be reached the organisers have the right to either cancel the meeting or sub-divide, add, delete or amalgamate classes as necessary. Amalgamations will be posted at the conclusion of documentation and will be final.

13. Entries:

13.1 Entries open on publication of these Regulations and **close 14 days before the event. The entry fee is £75.00**

13.2 **We encourage you to enter on-line at www.torbaymotorclub.co.uk. Please log-on to the website, open an account, enter and save your entry details, and commentary information, and then submit your entry and pay on-line.**

13.3 If you are unable to use the website-based entry process, a hard copy of the entry form can be requested from the Entry Secretary:

All paper entries MUST be made on an Official Entry Form, accompanied by the correct fee and including full contact details. Remember to include a completed Entry Form and the full Entry Fee for each driver.

13.4 All entries will be acknowledged and accepted by notification of Final Instructions, which will be despatched by e-mail on or before Saturday 10th May 2019.

- 13.5 Entries will be accepted on first received basis until the maximum entry number is reached; this will also apply to any reserves. Enquiries relating to vehicle eligibility should be directed to the Motorsport UK Scrutineer (see officials list, SR 17, below). All other enquiries may be directed to Secretary of the Meeting (SR17).
- 13.6 An entry will remain provisional until the full fee is received. **Post-dated cheques will NOT be accepted; cheques will not be banked until the Closing Date.**
- 13.7 **Entry Fees:**
The entry fee for the event shall be **£75** (seventy-five pounds) and all cheques must be made payable to **Torbay Motor Club**.
Late entries, received after the closing date, may exceptionally be accepted, subject to a revised entry fee of **£85** (eighty-five pounds) which will be non-refundable. Irrespective of the entry submission method used, post-dated cheques will NOT be accepted.
Charges of up to £15.00 will be levied in the event of a cheque requiring re-presentation. This does not preclude the application of **C1.1.13**
- 13.8 **Acknowledgement & selection of entries:**
Receipt of entries will be acknowledged which should not be construed as acceptance of entry unless specifically stated.
Telephone entries will not be accepted.
Entries will be selected at the organiser's discretion (**D14.1.1**).
- 13.9 **Withdrawal of entry:**
Entries withdrawn and confirmed in writing to the Entry Secretary on or before the final closing date in SR13 will be refunded less £15.00 administration fee.
Entries withdrawn after closing date and before the 17th May 2019, subject to the conditions shown below, may be offered a 50% refund (after an administration fee has been deducted). To qualify for a 50% refund, competitors must fulfil **ALL** the following conditions:
- 13.10 The competitor **MUST** telephone the Secretary of the Meeting prior to the day of the event to advise of his/her intention to withdraw. If the Secretary of the Meeting is temporarily unobtainable, a message recorded by the competitor offering clear identification will be acceptable.
- 13.11 The competitor **MUST** also provide written/emailed confirmation of withdrawal, which shall only apply to his/her individual entry, for receipt by the Secretary of the Meeting on or before the Wednesday immediately following the event.
- 13.12 In all cases, the competitor must communicate with the named **Secretary of the Meeting** in SR14, and no other person.
- 13.13 Any competitor or member of a support crew intending to arrive at the venue after 08.30 hrs **MUST** notify the Secretary of the Meeting in advance. Failure to do so will incur an entrance charge at the gate before being allowed access to the venue.

15. Results:

Provisional Results will be published in accordance with Regulation **D26.1.1**. Any protest or appeal must be lodged in accordance with **C6.1 to C6.6**.

16. Starting order:

- 16.1 Competitors will start singly at intervals of approximately 45 seconds and in class and numerical order.
- 16.2 Competitors **MUST** be ready to start their runs and to comply with the paddock official's instructions throughout the day or be prepared to forfeit their run.
- 16.3 Unless otherwise directed by a member of the Clerks of the Course Team, second (A) drivers will run in the batch prior to the class in which the car is entered.

17. Start Procedure:

- 17.1 The starting signal will be a green light.
- 17.2 The method of timing will be by light beam activated electronic clock.
- 17.3 Timing commences when the light beam is broken by the vertical timing strut on the front of the car. The timing strut is required to be matt black over the whole area **(254mm x 51mm)**. The bottom of the strut shall be not **less than 180mm & no more than 200mm from the ground**. No other, or further forward, part of the vehicle may interrupt these dimensions or actuate the timing. **S10.9**
- 17.4 There will be a designated tyre warming area.
- 17.5 The finish line will be identified by chequered boards.
- 17.6 If all four wheels of a competing vehicle leave the designated track no time will be given.

18. Red Flags and Baulking:

For a short period, there will be more than one car on the course at the same time. Red flags will be used (**S9.3.7**); if baulking occurs **S9.5.8** will apply.

19. Insurance:

Event insurance covering Third Party damage whilst on private land currently carries an excess of **£450** per incident (**Appendix 2, Paragraph 3**). The organising Club reserves the right to recover the cost of repair of any third-party damage, up to a maximum of **£450** per incident, from the entrant of any vehicle which causes such damage.

20. All other General Regulations of the Motorsport UK apply as written.

21. Overnight Camping:

Camping is permitted on Friday and Saturday nights in designated area. The site **MUST** be cleared after the event finishes on Sunday. Water will **NOT** be available on site. There will be no electric hook-ups and no generators are to be run between 10.00 p.m. & 7.00 a.m.

22. Competitors & Officials cars, support vehicles and equipment are parked in all areas of Wiscombe Park at their own risk.

Note: If you have only entered the Sunday event you will **NOT** be able to enter the venue until 20.00hrs on Saturday.
